## **Scout Eagle Troop Report 2015-2016**

This year has seen the split of the scout troop into 2 smaller troops, Eagle and Lion. This was done due to the demand on the group and the numbers of Scouts in the troop. Since the split we have seen increased attendance, less scouts leaving the group, greater participation and have had very positive feedback from both the Scouts and parents as we are able to run a better and more active programme due to the number of scouts being a lot more manageable both inside and outside of the hut.

The troop has continued to grow since the split and now has 22 members with more due to come up from Cubs next term.

I am pleased to report another fun packed year for Scouts which has included a wide range of both indoor and outdoor activities. We have also run meetings and activities where both Lion and Eagle troop have come together to ensure the troops still work closely and are in contact with one another. The most successful one so far being our trip to Flip out in Portsmouth where we had an exhausting hour of bouncing and jumping around.

Another great success this year was the Fund raising badge work where the Patrols self-lead their activities and communication and were able to raise money for the Friends of Chichester Hospital, RNLI and the Havant Food bank. This has resulted in members of these organisations coming to present the Scouts with certificates during meetings, offering to host us at their work place and also making it into the local papers for their good work.

This year's raft race was a great improvement on last years with Eagle troop entering 2 teams and taking 1st and 2nd place overall with a traditional style raft and a more innovative triangular shaped one.

We have had 2 camps so far this year, our first was winter camp in Braggers Woods where the Scouts learnt a lot about team work and were able to have a lot of fun snowboarding as well as our more traditional camp activities. The second camp was our survival camp held at our Harting woodland camp site where the boys built and slept in survival shelters, cooked "survival" food over fire and learnt how to set snares and disappear into the woods.

Our Patrol leaders have settled into their roles well since the slitting of the troop and have continued to develop their skills well, taking the lead on a number of nights and activities as well as supporting Jo and I on normal scout nights.
